Kurtis Foster, Veterans Services Officer, Madera County Veterans Services – The County Veterans Service Office is an office established by the Board of Supervisors of Madera County to assist veterans, dependents, and their survivors in receiving benefits they have earned or they are entitled to. The office is accredited by the State and follow County, State and Federal regulations pertaining to Veterans Affairs. The office serves all qualified Veterans, surviving spouses, and dependents that is estimated to be around 21, 000. The office help Veterans file claims for Compensation, Pension, Survivors benefits, burial allowances, aid and attendance, driver's license verifications, VA healthcare enrollment, college fee waivers, order service and service treatment records and appeals. The largest amount of veterans seen by the office is for PTSD, hearing loss, diabetes, cancer, and distrust of the government and the VA. Kurtis Foster is the Director and Anita Pasqual is the Senior Representative, there are also 2 other temporary workers who help in office duties. The average wait time is two weeks to obtain services.
