#### **COMMENTS**

The County of Madera contracts with Red Rock Environmental Group, LLC to operate the County's sanitary landfill at Fairmead (Landfill) and the County's Norht Fork Transfer Station in Eastern Madera County. The Landfill is open to the public six days per week (Monday-Saturday) from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., except for certain Holidays. The North Fork Transfer Station is open to the public 5 days per week (Thursday-Monday) from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility was constructed and placed into operation in 2007/2008 at the Landfill in an effort to divert HHW from being deposited into the Landfill. The HHW facility is open on Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and there is no cost to County residents to dispose of household hazardous waste at the HHW facility. These waste disposal facilities are integral to the County's solid waste services provided to the residnets of Madera County. In addition to the operation of these solid waste facilities, the County also has two contract franchise haulers that provide solid waste collection services for the residents of Madera County. Red Rock Environmental Group is the franchisee for waste collected from areas below the 1,000 ft elevation and Emadco Disposal is the franchisee for waste collected from areas above the 1,000 ft elevation.

#### **Solid Waste Flow Control Agreement**

On February 5, 2013, the County and the City of Chowchilla entered into a new Solid Waste Flow Control Agreement. The initial term of the agreement is for five years, and the County will negotiate an extension of the expired Contract at a different rate meanwhile, it is on a month-to-month basis. The agreement contains provisions which ensure all of the City of Chowchilla's solid waste is delivered to Fairmead, and allows the City diversion credits to comply with AB 939, which mandated diversion goals of 50%. The agreement allows for a reduced contractual tipping fee and allows for annual adjustments based on CPI. The projected tipping fees for 2019-20 are at least \$22.28/ton (until a new contract extension is in place) for Municipal Solid Waste (MSW), \$14.63/ton for Yard Waste and \$16.14/ton for Wood Waste.

On July 14, 2015, the Board entered into a Landfill Use Agreement with Mid Valley Disposal (MVD), Inc. to deliver the City of Madera's solid waste to the Fairmead Landfill. The Agreement requires MVD to bring a minimum of 20,000 tons per year to the Fairmead Landfill and it expires on December 31, 2020. The Current tipping fees are \$21.50/ton for gray can waste, \$14.50/ton for Green can waste, \$0.00/tom for blue can/recyclables waste, and \$16.00/ton for wood waste.

## **Public Tipping Fee Rates**

On August 21, 2018, the Board of Supervsiors approved Resolution 2018-115 which set the franchise hauler tipping fee for municipal solid waste (MSW) at \$55/ton at the Fairmead Landfill. Resolution 2018-115 also set the Non-Contract/Self Hauler tipping fees for MSW at \$60/ton for the Fairmead Landfill and \$86/ton for the North Fork Transfer Station. The per ton tipping fee for MSW at the North Fork Transfer Station will automatically adjust to \$105.78/ton on July 1, 2019 per approved Resolution 2018-115. In addition to the aforementioned per ton tipping fees, the flat rate tipping fee for loads up to 500 pounds was set at \$20 and the flat rate for 3-can service was set at \$10 for both the Fairmead Landfill and North Fork Transfer Station waste disposal facilities. The franchise hauler tipping

fees at Fairmead Landfill for Wood Waste and Green Waste remain at \$16.21/ton and \$14.29/ton respectively. The Non-Contract/Self Hauler tipping fees at both the Fairmead Landfill and North Fork Transfer Station for Wood Waste and Green Waste remain at \$30.39/ton and \$20.26/ton respectively.

## **ESTIMATED REVENUES**

This budget is funded by landfill surcharges based on the current tipping fees and rents received. The Valley Collection Franchise agreement with Redrock Environmental Group and the Mountain Franchise Agreement with Emadco Disposal have a franchise fee of 6% of gross billings.
