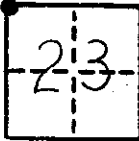

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF CORNER FOUND; EVIDENCE AND METHOD USED TO IDENTIFY OR REESTABLISH

Found and Accepted: A 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" hand hewn pine post in a 3' diameter rock mound. Found 2 original bearing trees per GLO field notes of J. M. Anderson U.S. Deputy Surveyor 1881.

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS RESULT OR PERPETUATED

Remonumented with F.S.M., up 7". Rebuilt rock mound 3' dia. x 7" high around monument. Set a metal post with Forest Service monument signs attached 4' ± NE of the corner. Placed found post alongside of F.S.M..

F.S.M. - Aluminum monument, 2 1/2" O.D., 30"-long with a 3 1/4" O.D. aluminum cap stamped for the corner, with LS 4689, the date and the Forest Service logo.

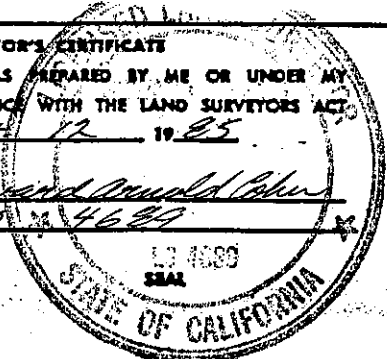
