E. EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION

Marizela Terkildsen, Health Education Coordinator, Suicide Prevention Collaborative. A brief history of how the collaborative was established as a result of passage of Assembly Bill 2246. This bill includes that local educational agencies that serves pupils in grades 7 to 12, include school employed mental health professionals and suicide prevention experts and at minimum, address procedures relating to suicide prevention, intervention, and post-vention. Marizela and an employee of public health volunteered to co-chair and take leadership of the Suicide Collaborative of Madera County committee. The Mission statement is to support prevention, intervention, post-vention through community wellness with the goal of reducing suicide and promoting community conversation. The Vision is a suicide-safer community that promotes wellness. There has been several accomplishments one of which is a decision tree on student mental health that was developed. Marizela shared a portion of a video that has been presented on school campuses and the video that is shared is age appropriate. Looking forward the committee wants better coordinate mental health services in the community and improve accessibility to youth. Also have a common language for understanding trauma and mental health to effectively plan and deliver services. If anyone is interested in joining the collaborative they meet the 2nd Tuesday of every month at Madera Unified School District office 1820 Howard Road.

2. <u>BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES (BHS) PROGRAM REPORTS</u>

Irene Blanco, LCSW, Supervising Mental Health Clinician – Department of Social Services (DSS), (CCR) Coordination, Lake Street Center (LSC), Juvenile Justice (JJS) & Healthy Beginnings (HB). Irene supervisors 10 staff members and oversees their caseloads. She has been at Behavioral Health Services (BHS) for over 14 years; Irene started as a case manager, then was a pre-licensed clinician, received her license and then became a Supervisor. The Lake Street team has 2 clinicians, 2 case managers and provide mental health services to children involved in child welfare. There is a collaborative meeting for staff to have cases in common. There is individual therapy, case management, love and logic classes, parenting orientation groups both in English and in Spanish. The JJS team has 2 clinicians and has an opening for a case manager which provides service to youth that are involved in the Juvenile Justice system. There are Love and Logic classes provided along with Parent Orientation Groups and Pathways, which is a group for sexual offenders. The Healthy Beginning team has 2 clinicians and provides services for children 0-5 years of age. This team helps with bonding and attachment and parenting. Irene is the Katie A coordinator which is responsible for all referrals that come through from Child Welfare Services (CWS). She ensures the children are assessed in a timely manner to receive appropriate services.

Dennis discussed next year's County/State contract. There could be wholesale changes as it will incorporate changes from the State to reflect the 2020 Waiver if the Feds approve it. The State will release their first draft to the public the end of October. This may reveal new financing schemes. The State is looking to update our financing scheme away from reimbursement by the minute to paying for services at a set contracted rate. Hopefully this will reduce the time to settle our costs. The State is currently settling our FY2011-12 cost report. I will give updates to this process over the coming months to bring the Board and myself up to speed.
