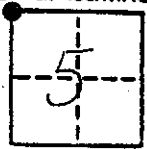

Found and Accepted: A 1 1/4" O.D. iron pipe, up 12", with a 2" dia. brass cap stamped for the corner, the date and the GLO logo. Found 1 original bearing tree per GLO field notes of A.W. Brown, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, 1917.

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS RESULT OR PERPETUATED

Left the monument as found.
Set a metal post with Forest Service monument signs attached, 4' ± SE of the corner.

Monument is on an east-west fence line.

Monument lies 16' south of the centerline of a 13' wide dirt road.

Bearings are to the center of trees at the base. Distances are horizontal to a nail and tag (stamped LS 4689) driven into the side center of the root crown, unless otherwise noted.

Posted Forest Service monument and bearing tree signs on trees 1, 5 and 6.

Blazed and scribed tree #6 in accordance with the BLM 1973 "Manual of Surveying Instructions".
