E. <u>EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION</u>

Elizabeth Wisener, Community Services Program Manager, Madera Community Action Partnership (MCAP) – Elizabeth reported on Homelessness and MCAP; funding for homelessness has gone for nonexistent to over 1 million dollars. MCAP is in the process of creating a one stop shop, a coordinator has been hired to oversee the program and hire 2 caseworkers. MCAP is able to assist anyone who is in jeopardy of losing their housing, or has lost their housing, or has been homeless for countless years. In 2019-20 MCAP contracted with Behavioral Health Services (BHS) to hire to outreach workers. They have had 804 contacts, 32 entered job programs, 111 were referred to BHS, 57 entered shelters or were placed in permanent housing, and 20 clients over the age of 65 were placed in Hotels due to the COVID 19 pandemic. In response to a question regarding tenants' rights in temporary shelters, Elizabeth explained that the clients must sign an acknowledgement of no tenant rights. MCAP also will be including rapid rehousing, which helps to maintain housing for a period of months by paying rent from now until December. Homelessness Prevention helps those who are behind in their rent not to become homeless. MCAP also has permanent housing; Shunnamite House is for someone who has been chronically homeless and needs ongoing support. The program has grown to have 22 beds and after 3-5 years the participants are ready to move out and be on their own. This November they will be an additional 14 beds available, MCAP is still looking for units available to rent. Homeless Outreach is also reaching

out to not only Homelessness on the street or riverbeds but those who are families who have had to double up or someone who is couch surfing, etc. HHAP contract with BHS is \$411,434 which allows for an additional \$34,000 which must be spent on clients between the ages of 18-24. MCAP has made an offer on a building however have not heard back as of yet. Transportation from the mountains is available by contacting the Outreach Workers who will help transport from the mountains to services needed. The phone number will be sent out.
