



Benefits of Smoke-Free Parks in the City of Madera

Smoking is the number one cause of preventable death in the US. Secondhand smoke has chemicals that can cause cancer. There is no safe level of exposure.

- One cigarette butt takes up to 7 years to break down.
- Butts can harm children, pets, wildlife, soil, water and air.
- Smoking exposes people nearby to the toxic chemicals found in secondhand smoke
- Secondhand smoke has nicotine and other toxic chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects, and lung disease.
