Appendix: Community Assets and Areas for Improvement

The Community Health Assessment survey tool, distributed to the community in Madera County, consisted of several free-text response questions that aim to gather information on positive assets and areas of improvement. Questions asked for the top two things the individual is most proud of in his/her community and two things the individual would like to see improvement. Qualitative analysis was conducted by coding individuals' responses into relevant themes. Themes were then tabulated to reveal community's perceived assets to leverage and negative indicators for targeted interventions. Count of themes indicated how many times the specific reason category came up during the course of the Community Health Assessment among individuals who chose to answer to the questions.

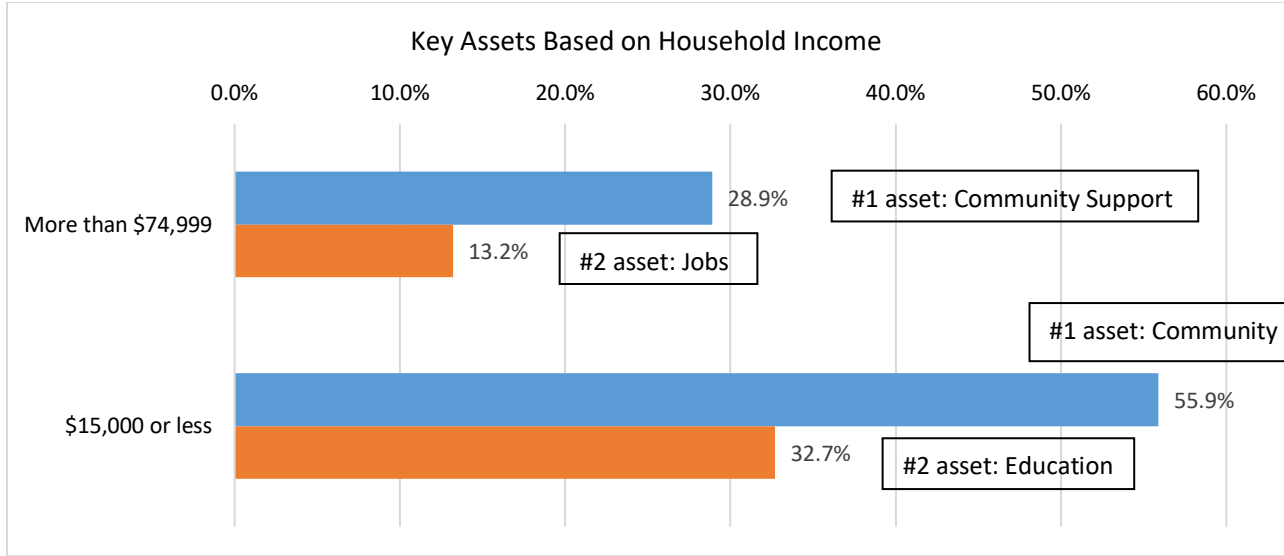
Top two reasons for being proud in the community were identified to be community support and safety. Examples of comments associated with community support were receiving help when needed in the community, having good neighbors, receiving hospitality from the community, indicating that there are people in the community that are tightknit, having good friends network, and people knowing each other. Example of safety included having community watch, active and good emergency response network, having low crime, having little violence, and having reliable law enforcement.

Assets could be different depending on household income status. Because of this reason, the Madera County Department of Public Health conducted additional analysis breaking down the top household income category (household earning above \$75,000) and comparing with the lowest income category (<\$15,000), to identify any inequity.

Despite the top #1 asset for the two income categories were the same, the proportion of the individuals in the income group are vastly different. The lower income individuals depend more heavily on community support. In addition, individuals in the higher income group experiences better jobs search or opportunities compared to the lower income group.

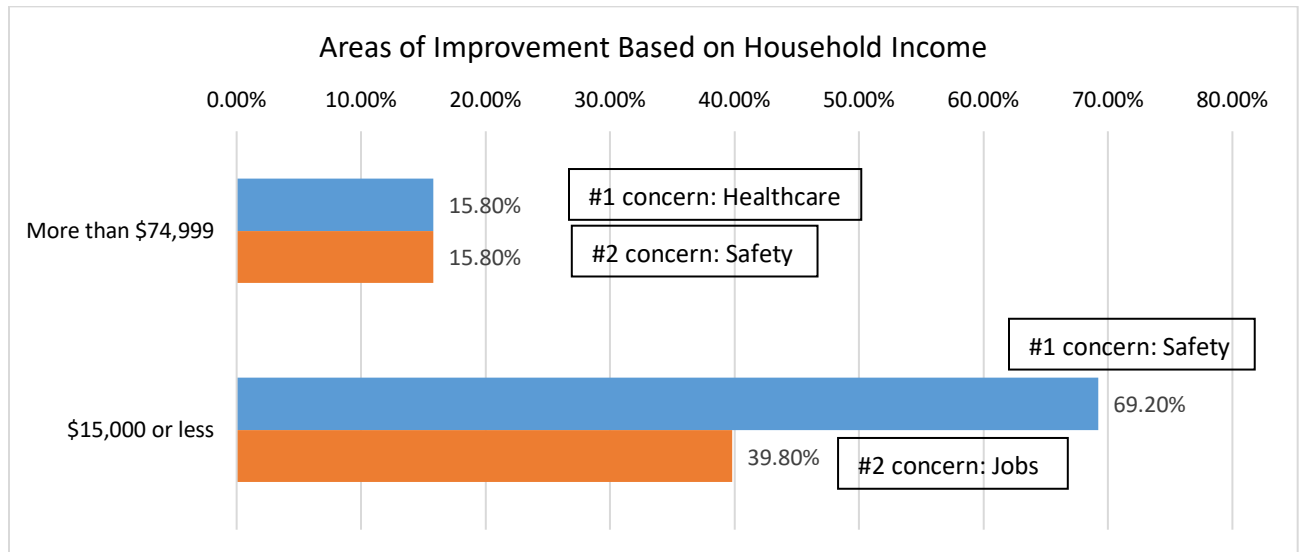

The two keys areas of improvement mentioned in the surveys included safety and jobs. Safety concerns revolve around crime rate, gang violence, crime relating to drug use, delinquency, lack of law enforcement officers, lack of law enforcement patrol at night, safety in parks, thefts, safe workplace and school, graffiti, drunk driving, speeding, fights, and lack of law enforcement patrol in community events. Key reason for community's dissatisfaction relating to jobs were the lack of job opportunities, better/ more quality jobs, higher paying jobs, and lack of job fairs.





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Areas of improvement differed for the individuals who reported lower household income compared to those with higher household income. Safety was indicated as a major concern for the lower household income group at (69.2%) and job search/opportunity/situation was dissatisfactory for 39.8% of the lower income group. Similar to the asset result, despite safety being mentioned as one of the top two concerns, safety concern was more than 4-fold higher in the low income compared to the higher income group.
