Dear Leonard,

I am the Responsible Managing Officer for Wellco Drilling, Inc., a company which holds a Class C57, Water Well Drilling Contractor's License in the State of California. This license was issued to Wellco Drilling, Inc. in 1989.

Over the past 20 years, my company has had extensive experience drilling wells in the granite foothills of the western slope of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Over that time period, I have been hired to construct hundreds of hard rock wells. It has always been my experience that water sufficient to provide domestic water needs, generally will be encountered by drilling from 100 to approximately 1500 feet in depth depending on location and formations encountered.

Over the past ten years, I drilled no less than 18 wells within a 3 mile radius of the Madera Quarry project. The depths of the wells range between 402 and 1175 feet. In every instance, an operating well was constructed yielding sufficient water to serve the needs of the customer.

In September of 2008, I drilled a well on the property of Madera Quarry. It took our company three days to drill this well to a depth of over 900 feet, which yielded an estimate of 103 gallons per minute.

Based on the above experiences, it is my opinion that within 2 to 4 days, I would be able to successfully drill a well within the 3 mile radius of the Madera Quarry property, which would yield adequate volumes for domestic use.
