Key reasons to enroll in the program now:

- Be prepared: when vaccines are approved for children they will be required for school and demand will be high.
- There are fewer barriers to enroll.
- Pfizer is easier to store! It can be stored up to 10 weeks in a routine refrigerator.
- Pfizer now comes in smaller standard order sizes and is also available through small orders.
- Get reimbursed for \$40 administration fee and no-cost vaccines.
- You don't need to be enrolled in VFC or offer Medi-Cal services
- Your strong recommendation as a provider is one of the most important factors in your patients' decision to get vaccinated.
- Providers in the Vaccines for Children Program are already set up for proper storage and administration.





Provider Onboarding Journey

Steps to enroll-Contact us if you need assistance

1. **Organization:** Designate Staff to fill organization and locations coordinator roles
2. **Organization Coordinator:** Ensure your organization will meet all program requirements by reviewing [CDC Provider Agreement](#)
3. **Organization Coordinator:** Enroll clinic locations with local IIS. (If not already enrolled.)
4. **Organization Coordinator:** Create Account within [myCAvax](#) and complete required trainings
5. **Organization Coordinator:** Complete Section A: **Enroll Parent organization**. CEO/CMO e-signs
6. **Organization Coordinator:** Invite location coordinators to complete Section B for provider locations
7. **Location Coordinator:** Create account and complete required trainings in [myCAvax](#)
8. **Location Coordinator:** Complete Section B: **Enroll Provider Locations**; Vaccine Coordinator e-signs.

*CDPH reviews and approves location applications in 3-5 business days.

Covid Testing

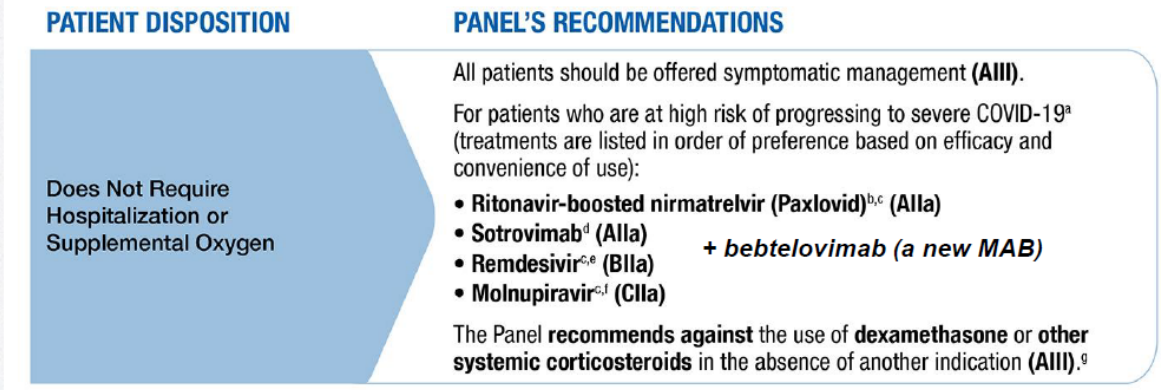
Many clinics and providers have established connections with laboratories to carry out COVID testing.

Table A. Patient Risk Groups for Prioritizing the Use of Anti-SARS-CoV-2 Therapy

Tier	Risk Group
1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immunocompromised individuals who are not expected to mount an adequate immune response to COVID-19 vaccination or SARS-CoV-2 infection due to their underlying conditions, regardless of their vaccine status (see Immunocompromising Conditions below); or • Unvaccinated individuals who are at the highest risk of severe disease (anyone aged ≥75 years or anyone aged ≥65 years with additional risk factors)
2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unvaccinated individuals who are at risk of severe disease and who are not included in Tier 1 (anyone aged ≥65 years or anyone aged <65 years with clinical risk factors)
3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vaccinated individuals who are at high risk of severe disease (anyone aged ≥75 years or anyone aged ≥65 years with clinical risk factors) • Vaccinated individuals who have not received a COVID-19 vaccine booster dose are likely to be at higher risk for severe disease; patients who have not received a booster dose and who are within this tier should be prioritized for treatment.
4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vaccinated individuals who are at risk of severe disease (anyone aged ≥65 years or anyone aged <65 with clinical risk factors) • Vaccinated individuals who have not received a COVID-19 vaccine booster dose are likely to be at higher risk for severe disease; patients who have not received a booster dose and who are within this tier should be prioritized for treatment.
