Mr. Braun:

Thank you for the opportunity to assist with the preparation of the Greater Rio Mesa Area Municipal Service Review (MSR) and Sphere of Influence (SOI) Update. Since the last MSR/SOI Update was completed in 2012, at least two communities in the study area have had significant development activity and several other key decisions about service provisions have been made.

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

LAFCO Experience

Understanding

Madera Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is responsible for conducting Municipal Service Reviews (MSR) and Sphere of Influence (SOI) studies for cities and special districts within Madera County. MSRs and SOI updates are essential to efficiently provide public services without unnecessary duplication or overlap while making decisions that reflect the needs and interests of the community. As a California firm, QK understands the significant role LAFCOs play in shaping the local government structure and organization, and that they are a valuable tool for agencies to effectively and efficiently meet constituents' needs.

For this project, LAFCO seeks a consulting firm to prepare an MSR and SOI Update for the Greater Rio Mesa Area per the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (CKH Act), LAFCO Service Review Guidelines, and the Madera LAFCO's Policies and Guidelines. In this role, QK will act as an extension of LAFCO staff to provide a third-party point of view that LAFCOs are mandated to offer regarding urban growth, municipal service delivery, and agricultural land/open space preservation issues.


Municipal Service Review Purpose

An MSR goes beyond a simple management plan or audit by examining all aspects of the agency, including infrastructure needs, deficiencies, management practices, and financing. As a precursor to SOI updates, MSRs provide LAFCO with the necessary information to make informed decisions regarding an agency's growth potential and service provision capabilities. Having a consultant like QK with extensive experience providing MSRs and SOI studies is essential to generating accurate information to manage local agencies and prepare for their future.

An accurate and thorough MSR is critical to the success of the SOI study. Incorrect or incomplete analysis in an MSR undermines the SOI study, which is why QK uses a thorough quality assurance/quality control process. An internal third-party individual who is not involved in the daily project work will review the MSR before it is finalized to validate our analysis.

Spheres of Influence Purpose

SOIs are crucial because they determine the growth potential and boundaries of an agency within a specified period. This allows for better planning and management of resources, infrastructure, and services provided by the agency. QK's years of experience completing SOI studies provide us with a long-term understanding of how the SOIs we helped develop addressed community growth and resource management. We can use specific information gathered from previous SOI studies and implementation to make poignant recommendations and conduct an informed study to meet Madera LAFCO's needs.



Relevant Experience

Since 2010, QK has prepared nine MSRs for Madera LAFCO, including the 2010 Greater Rio Mesa Area MSR. We have also peered reviewed two MSRs that were prepared by others for Madera LAFCO and, because of our knowledge of special districts in Madera County, have also provided consulting services to several special districts, including Madera Irrigation District, Madera County Mosquito & Vector Control District, and Madera Cemetery District. Our experience is not limited to Madera County, as we have previously prepared MSRs in the following counties in the last five years: Kern, Kings, Fresno, El Dorado, Alameda, and Orange.

Madera County has planned for a major shift from rural to urbanized uses in the Greater Rio Mesa Area. Therefore, a thoughtful review of municipal service needs for both existing neighborhoods and future communities is needed to help ensure that services are efficiently provided. Here are some things we learned when we prepared the 2010 Greater Rio Mesa Area MSR that will require further examination in this MSR/SOI Update:

Population and Development

The 2010 MSR estimated the combined population of Bonadelle Ranchos #9, Sumner Hill, and Rolling Hills (which is covered by Maintenance District No. 14, County Service Area No. 16, and County Service Area No. 19) to be 1,581 residents in 2010. None of the more recently approved communities had started to develop. The Dragonfly Golf Course (formerly Riverbend Golf Course) had been developed and Valley Children's Hospital had relocated to its current site, but the planned development around these two key developments had not yet started. Since then, residential development has started at the Gateway Village (now called Riverstone) and Tesoro Viejo neighborhoods.

Root Creek Water District

At the time of the MSR, Root Creek Water District was only providing agricultural water services. LAFCO activated the district's latent powers in 2013 to provide municipal water, wastewater, and storm drainage services for the Riverstone development. Since then, the District has adopted fees and assessments to cover the costs of the new services it provides.

Sierra Foothills Public Utility District

Sierra Foothills Public Utility District was the subject of a 2014 State Controller Audit. No homes were constructed in the district as planned at its formation in 1998. Since the last MSR, the district transferred the golf course ownership due to a court order; therefore, it appears that the district is not providing any public services. The previous MSR recommended that Sierra Foothills Public Utility District be dissolved, and its services transferred to County Service Area No. 22.



County Service Area No. 16 (Sumner Hill)

County Service Area No. 16 supplies and distributes water to residents and other users in the district. The area does not appear to have grown since the last MSR was written; however, expenses appear to have increased approximately 70% since the FY 2008/09 budget shown in the 2010 MSR. Costs for utilities and for system maintenance make up for most of the cost increase. The 2010 MSR recommended that County Service Area No. 16 be consolidated with County Service Area No. 22.

County Service Area No. 19 (Rolling Hills)

County Service Area No. 19 supplies and distributes water and provides street maintenance for residents and other users in the district. Recent water system improvements that required the borrowing of funds in the form of a bond. The 2010 MSR recommended that County Service Area No. 19 be consolidated with County Service Area No. 22.

County Service Area No. 22 (Table Mountain)


County Service Area No. 22 provides street maintenance, street lighting, and fire protection services, and is the Greater Rio Mesa Area's largest district. Since the last MSR, the district territory expanded to include the Riverstone development (road maintenance only). Revenues and expenses for the Tesoro Viejo, Gunner West, and Riverstone developments are accounted for separately in the County's budgeting. This area has seen significant housing growth, which is expected to continue.

Maintenance District No. 14 (Bonadelle Ranchos #9)

Maintenance District No. 14 provides street maintenance to district residents. The district has built a large fund balance since before the last MSR, and it appears that the balance was budgeted for a major road maintenance project in the 2022/23 budget. The previous MSR recommended that the territory covered by Maintenance District No. 14 be annexed into County Service Area No. 22 so that other municipal services could be provided.

Maintenance District No. 57 (Adobe)

Maintenance District No. 57 provides street maintenance to the residents in the district. The district has been building a fund balance since before the last MSR, and it appears that the balance was budgeted for a road maintenance project in the 2022/23 budget. The previous MSR recommended that the territory covered by Maintenance District No. 57 be annexed into County Service Area No. 22 so that other municipal services could be provided.





Scope of Work

MSR/SOI Update Approach

Project Kick-Off

Our initial project step is to meet with Madera LAFCO staff to establish communication protocols and communication expectations between our team and yours. We will also identify and collect relevant data, suggest scope adjustments if needed, and prepare a questionnaire for the County of Madera and utility service providers. This important first step establishes the foundation upon which the subsequent tasks are built, so we emphasize clearly understanding your objectives and needs for this specific scope.

Contact Agencies and Collect Data

We request relevant information identified during the kick-off stage from the relevant agencies and individuals. Our team also administers the questionnaire to applicable entities with appropriate follow-up and communication to drive participation.

Data Analysis


We organize and analyze the data that we collect through documentation and questionnaires to address each of the topic areas prescribed by the CKH Act for MSRs and SOI Updates. This includes using of LAFCO's GIS data to prepare maps that illustrate the overlapping district boundaries and SOIs.

Solicit Feedback

We will prepare an Administrative Draft MSR/SOI Update for review by LAFCO staff before the release of any public drafts. This draft will facilitate collaboration between QK and LAFCO staff on the analysis and the wording determinations in the Draft MSR.

Drafts, Final MSR/SOI Update

The scope includes two meetings with the Commission, first with the Public Review Draft and then with the Final Draft for adoption. Throughout the process, the affected districts and interested stakeholders will have opportunities to provide input and comment on the MSR/SOI Update.



Scope of Work

The following tasks describe our proposed scope of work for completion of the MSR/SOI Update from project initiation through Commission approval. We also included a proposed schedule following this scope.

TASK 1.0 PROJECT INITIATION | AGENCY CONTACT | DATA COLLECTION

Upon contract execution and notice to proceed, we will meet with LAFCO staff to initiate the scope of work described herein. QK will cover the following items during this meeting:

- 1. Establish communication protocols and communication expectations between the QK team and LAFCO staff.
- 2. Collect available relevant data from Madera LAFCO.
- 3. Identify documents and data expected to be available from the identified agencies.
- Review the scope of work and schedule and make revisions as directed by LAFCO staff.
- Prepare a questionnaire that will be sent to the County of Madera and other utility service providers to obtain information.

QK will contact the primary points of contact at each of the following agencies to establish working relationships and effective lines of communication. During our initial communication, we will also summarize the scope of our work.

County Service Area No. 19 (Rolling Hills)

QK will prepare a questionnaire that, after being reviewed and approved by LAFCO staff, will be sent to the agency contacts to obtain the information needed to complete certain parts of the analysis per the issue areas listed in Task 3.0. The questionnaire will not be the sole means of communication with staff; rather, it should be viewed as a convenient checklist that will facilitate the task of identifying and collecting the requested information. QK will also collect budgets, rate studies, and other documents that can be useful in understanding the administration of each district.

TASK 2.0 INTERPRETATION AND ANALYSIS

The QK team will analyze the data collected in Task 1.0 concerning the issue areas identified in the CKH Act. The CKH Act requires analysis of, and determinations for, seven issue areas:

- 1. Growth and population projections for the affected area.
- 2. The location and characteristics of any disadvantaged unincorporated communities within or contiguous to the sphere of influence.
- 3. Present and planned capacity of public facilities, adequacy of public services, and infrastructure needs or deficiencies, including needs or deficiencies related to sewers, municipal and industrial water, and structural fire protection in any disadvantaged, unincorporated communities within or contiguous to the sphere of influence.
- 4. Financial ability of agencies to provide services.
- 5. Status of, and opportunities for, shared facilities.
- 6. Accountability for community service needs, including governmental structure and operational efficiencies.
- 7. Any other matter related to effective or efficient service delivery, as required by commission policy.

In addition, the CKH Act specifies that SOI studies include analyses and determinations for the following five issue areas:

- 1. The present and planned land uses in the area, including agricultural and openspace lands.
- 2. The present and probable need for public facilities and services in the area.
- 3. The present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the agency provides or is authorized to provide.
- 4. The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if the commission determines that they are relevant to the agency.
- 5. For an update of a SOI of a city or special district that provides public facilities or services related to sewers, municipal and industrial water, or structural fire protection, the present and probable need for those public facilities and services of any disadvantaged unincorporated communities within the existing SOI.

As we conduct the analysis, if any questions arise, we will follow up the affected agency, request additional data, and meet on site as needed.

TASK 3.0 PREPARE ADMINISTRATIVE DRAFT MSR/SOI UPDATE

The QK team will prepare an administrative draft of the MSR/SOI Update in the LAFCO's preferred format. The reports will address the issue areas listed in Task 3.0 and will be supported by tables, graphics, and GIS-based maps, as appropriate. The MSR/SOI Update will include analysis of the districts listed in Task 1.0 using the CKH Act requirements listed in Task 2.0. The Administrative Draft version will be for LAFCO staff review only.

TASK 4.0 PRESENT PUBLIC REVIEW DRAFT MSR/SOI UPDATE


Upon completion of the Administrative Draft, QK will meet LAFCO staff to review the information contained in the MSR. We will look to LAFCO staff to either confirm or discuss revisions to the determinations before we incorporate them into the Public Draft MSR/SOI Update. QK will prepare the Public Draft MSR/SOI Update based on feedback, comments, and direction received from LAFCO staff. This draft will be sent to the affected agencies for their review and comment prior to the first meeting with the Commission.

QK will present the Draft MSR/SOI Update at a Commission hearing, where the Commission will be asked to approve the MSR/SOI Update. Our level of participation will be in accordance with LAFCO staff requests and can include presenting the key conclusions and determinations contained in the report.

QK will prepare the Draft MSR/SOI Update following the Commission hearing. The Final report will address and respond to any direction provided by LAFCO staff by the Commission at the final meeting.

TASK 5.0 REVIEW COMMENTS RECEIVED | PREPARE FINAL DRAFT MSR/SOI UPDATE

After consulting with LAFCO staff, the comments will be addressed, and revisions will be incorporated into the Final Draft MSR/SOI Update.


ASSUMPTIONS
