C.A.R.E. Court, Proposition 1, Medi-Cal Service Utilization Data, OSF Spending Plan Updates

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# **Overview of Proposition 1**

#### Proposition 1-Two Major Components:

- 1. Changes the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) that was passed by voters in 2004, with a focus on how the money from the act can be used. The Act is now known as the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA).
- 2. Approves a \$6.4 billion bond to build (1) more places for mental health care and drug or alcohol treatment and (2) more housing for people with mental health, drug, or alcohol challenges.
- SUD integration: Counties have long maintained that funds from the Mental Health Services Act, now known as the Behavioral Health Services Act, should be more adaptable to incorporate substance use disorder (SUD) programs. Prior to Prop 1, MHSA dollars were restricted and could only be used to serve clients with SUD who also live with a mental health condition. We look forward to the opportunity Prop 1 provides to better integrate SUD treatment with our current behavioral health programs.
- ➤ Housing: Bond funding will lead to the building of new bricks and mortar infrastructure to house and treat clients of county behavioral health. In addition, changes to the MHSA will require counties to spend a third of the existing millionaire's tax on rental subsidies and other housing options for our clients. More housing and treatment beds will benefit our clients. Thousands of county behavioral health clients are currently actively receiving treatment despite not having permanent housing or shelter. Being able to provide more of our clients a safe space to live while they receive treatment is a welcome opportunity to build on the many successful recovery stories county behavioral health programs help to bring about every day.



# MHSA Changes with Proposition 1

- Prop 1 makes no changes to the amount of money collected through the MHSA (now BHSA) tax, but the money would be used differently.
- Prop 1 will change how counties can use BHSA dollars to allow counties to use the funds to treat substance use disorders, even if the client does not also have a cooccurring mental health diagnosis, thereby expanding the number of people eligible to be served with the same dollars.
- Prop 1 significantly changes the categories under which counties must allocate BHSA dollars. Most significantly, BHSA creates a new requirement that one third (30%) of funds allocated in each county (with some possible exceptions for rural counties) must be spent on housing interventions for people with mental illness, and at least half of these dollars for people who are chronically homeless, with a focus on encampments; 35% of the funds will be for Full Service Partnership Programs; and 35% for Bundled Categories of MHSA Funding (i.e., CSS, PEI, WET, CFTN, & INN)
- Counties will not receive additional funding under Prop 1 for services previously funded by MHSA; therefore, less money will be available for non-housing services under BHSA, particularly legacy mental health services currently funded through the Mental Health Services Act. Examples of mental health needs that must be met with fewer resources include prevention programs, outpatient mental health treatment, responding to people in a mental health crisis, children's mental health, and important outreach efforts to engage people in need of mental health care services and treatment,



# MHSA Changes with Proposition 1

Prop 1 increases the allocation of MHSA (now BHSA) dollars to the state from 5% to 10%. This shifts roughly \$140 million of money annually from the counties to the state. This amount would be higher or lower depending on the total amount of BHSA money collected annually.

- Of the state share, the proposition requires the state spend a dedicated amount of BHSA funding from counties toward statewide efforts to increase the number of behavioral health workers and preventing mental illness and drug or alcohol addiction across communities.
- o In 2023, CBHDA, in partnership with the Healthforce Center at UCSF and Kaiser Permanente of Southern California, released findings and statewide assessment of the state's behavioral health workforce needs.
  - > Specifically, the report identified a severe workforce shortage within the state's behavioral health professions. The report recommended additional state investments for strengthening, recruiting, and increasing the capacity and diversity of county behavioral health workforce professionals. The state and counties remain committed to implementing and expanding services to meet the needs of all Californians.
  - Under the BH-CONNECT 1115 Demonstration, which is expected to go live in 2025 pending CMS approval, the state will use a portion of the workforce funds redirected from counties to support expansion of a diverse behavioral health workforce through \$2.7 billion in long and short-term investments. Given that this investment will be made possible with funding currently allocated to counties, and the importance of the county behavioral health safety net, counties should be prioritized to support the next generation of diverse, culturally competent county behavioral health workforce.



# MHSA Changes with Proposition 1

With money from the \$6.4 billion bond included in Prop 1, local governments and tribes would receive grants and loans funded by the bond to build more places for mental health care and drug or alcohol treatment and more housing for people with mental health, drug, or alcohol challenges. The process by which these grants and loans will be distributed is not outlined in the Proposition. Bond funds can be used for physical structures, not operational, costs which would be carried by local governments.

# C.A.R.E. Act Background

- California Senate Bill 1338, known as the C.A.R.E., Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment Act, establishes a framework for providing care and supervision to individuals with severe psychotic disorders who are unable to care for their own health and well-being.
- This legislation targets the most vulnerable and resistant to traditional forms of treatment, offering a court-ordered Care Plan that includes comprehensive services like mental health treatment, substance use disorder services, and housing assistance.



## C.A.R.E. Act: What Is It?

#### C.A.R.E. Act Is:

- A civil court process
- A structured means to leverage court and behavioral health systems of care to support people in need of additional support
- For people suffering from primary psychotic disorders
- Open to eligible people with all insurances or uninsured
- A pathway to long-term sustainable behavioral health treatment and social supports





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### C.A.R.E. Act: What It Is Not?

#### C.A.R.E Act Is NOT:

- Punishment for declining to seek previous treatment or mandated treatment against someone's will
- A criminal diversion program
- Intended for ALL mental health diagnosis
- A purely homeless program
- The only solution for all potential respondents

## Who Can File a Petition?

#### From the Public

The respondent

Someone who resides with respondent

Family or other individual who stands in loco parentis to the respondent

First responder, homeless outreach worker, etc. who has had repeated interactions with the respondent

Licensed behavioral health professional

Public Guardian or public conservator of the county in which the respondent is present or believed to be present

**Adult Protective Services**

Judge of tribal court located in CA





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# Who Is Eligible for C.A.R.E. Court?

#### C.A.R.E. Court Eligibility

The respondent is 18 or older

Respondent is currently experiencing a severe mental illness and has a diagnosis of schizophrenia and other psychotic disorders

Not clinically stabilized in on-going voluntary treatment

Participation in a CARE plan or CARE agreement would be the least restrictive alternative necessary to ensure the person's recovery and stability

The Respondent is likely to benefit from the CARE program

At least one of the following is true:

- The respondent is unlikely to survive safely in the community without supervision and the person's condition is substantially deteriorating, or
- The respondent is in need of services and supports in order to prevent a relapse or deterioration that would be likely to result in grave disability or serious harm to the person or others, as defined in Section 5150



# MADERA COUNTY C.A.R.E. Court Planning Structure

Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 July-March







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
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


# MCDBHS SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES


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

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Mental Health America (MHA) launched Mental Health Week (which eventually became Mental Health Month) in 1949 to educate Americans about mental illness and to raise awareness about the conditions and the importance of mental wellness. Each year Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services requests that the Board of Supervisors sign a Proclamation proclaiming May as Mental Health Matters Month.

This proclamation demonstrates Madera County's support of May 2024 as Mental Health Matters Month. It encourages all citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses, and schools in Madera County to recommit our communities to increase awareness and understanding of mental illnesses. Mental Health Matters Month is celebrated throughout the United States and raises awareness about mental illnesses such as anxiety, depression, schizophrenia, and bipolar disorder. It also draws attention to suicide prevention, predominately precipitated by some of these mental illnesses.

Some people believe that mental health was not everyone's concern. They thought our



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annual mental health resources-even though they were shared with millions- were aimed at just a small group of people-the one in five who have a mental health concern in any given year. That is not the case today. Your approval of this Proclamation will recommit Madera County's increased awareness and understanding of mental illness and the ability to meet the need for appropriate and accessible services.

The Theme for 2024 is "Where to Start-Mental Health in a Changing World," The world is constantly changing - for better or for worse - and it can be overwhelming to deal with everything going on around you. While society is getting more comfortable discussing mental health, it can still be hard to know "Where to Start" when it comes to taking care of your own well-being.

Mental Health Month bringing to light the importance of sharing our journey of mental health and wellness, the support, and resources available, and overcoming stigma to inspire others to take action. This measure would recognize May 2024 as Mental Health Month in the County of Madera to enhance public awareness of mental health and eliminate its stigma.

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) administers the Mental Health Services Act, Lanterman-Petris-Short Act, Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness, Community Mental Health Services Block Grant, Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Block Grant, and Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program and oversees county provision of community mental health services pursuant to the Bronzan-McCorquodale Act. The County of Madera (County), through its Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS), must meet certain conditions and requirements to receive funding for these programs and community mental health services.

This Agreement, which is the County's performance contract, as required by Welfare and Institutions Code sections 5650, subd. (a), 5651, 5897, and California Code of Regulations, Title 9, section 3310, sets forth the conditions and requirements the



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County must meet in order to receive this funding. This Agreement does not cover federal financial participation or State general funds as they relate to Medi-Cal services provided through the Mental Health Plan Contracts. On 11/9/2022 Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS) received \$250,000.00 for the General Use of the Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment (CARE) Act Startup Funding to support the implementation of the CARE

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Act. On September 14, 2022, the Governor approved SB 1338, which enacted the CARE Act. The CARE Act creates a process, called the CARE process, in California's civil courts to provide earlier action, support, and accountability for both individuals with untreated schizophrenia spectrum and psychotic disorders, and the local governments responsible for providing behavioral health services to these individuals.

On 1/23/2023 MCDBHS received \$142,000.00 from the Department of State Hospitals for initial program implementation costs to administer a pre-trial felony mental health diversion program for individuals charged with felony offenses in its jurisdiction.

However, the monies received were deposited into the general fund in Fiscal Year 22-23. This TOA/RUR will move the monies from the general fund into the proper funds 1305 BHS-Care Court and 1306 BHS-St Hospital Diversion.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Approval of the recommended action will have no impact to the County's General Fund.


