- I. State Budget and Behavioral Health Allocations FY 2024-2025
 - A. Behavioral health remains a priority for the Newsom Administration.
 - B. State Budget has not been passed. The latest update from CBHDA, California Behavioral Health Directors Association, is that the budget may pass until end of July 2024. An update will be shared as soon as it's received.
 - C. The major reductions were noted in the CalWORKs Madera Access Program we have with Department of Social Services (\$600k), which may be reinstated. The Director of Social Services and I are monitoring this item; Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (\$132.5 million-\$207 million); Behavioral Health Workforce (\$300.9 million), Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI, \$426 million total), and Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC, \$10.5 million).
- II. Three-Year Mental Health Services Act FY2023-2026 Annual Plan Amendment
 - A. This plan will be posted this week for the required 30-Day Public Comment Period.
 - B. The plan will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval later this Summer for a final submission to Department of Healthcare Services (DHCS) by August 2024.
 - C. We plan to work with DHCS on this transition period to the new Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) under Proposition 1, to prevent any penalties.
- III. C.A.R.E. Act, Community Assistance Recovery and Empowerment Update
 - A. All committees continue to meet on a regular basis to develop implementation Plan CARE Court for Madera County. The committees are working on workflows, court operations, data reporting requirements, staffing plans, program design, etc.
 - B. We are on target to complete the CARE Court Implementation Plan by or before October 2024. Then, we plan to do a test of the Court and BHS processes early November, and be ready by 12/1/24, as required.
- IV. O.S.F. Opiate Settlement Funds Update
 - A. OSF Stakeholders' Oversight Committee continues to meet monthly.
 - B. The last meeting was 6/4/24.
 - C. BHS and the Sheriff's Office continue to plan the required priorities per the Board of Supervisors. All BHS staff have been hired. The oversight group is focusing on data and outcomes for the 5 priorities to ensure we show results and a good investment of these funds by the county. The next meeting is scheduled for 7/2/24, 8:30am at the CAO Conference Room, 4th Floor, at the Government Center.



V. BHS Department Data Reports

- A. Staffing Update
 - a. FY24-25 218 Budgetted Positions
 - b. 34 Vacancies including clinicians, substance abuse counselors, nurses, etc.
 - c. Current Vacancy Rate: 18.5%
 - d. Interviews for clinicians, division manager are in progress this week.
- B. Wait Times to Access Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

a. Madera MH 2 Days SUD 54 Days
 b. Chowchilla MH 10 Days SUD 81 Days
 c. Oakhurst MH 8 Days SUD 9 Days

- d. MH Wait Times are in compliance with DHCS requirements.
- e. SUD Wait Times are not regulated by DHCS currently; however, due to short SUD staffing, we are working on aligning the wait time standards with MH to prepare for this future requirement under BH Administrative Integration under CalAIM in 2025 and not later than 2027.
- f. SUD Division, under current interim assistant director, is working on restarting the strategies used last year including Double Booking, Drop-In Group, Group Intakes (Administrative Process only); Continue Walk-In Services, Offer Telehealth (Phone and Video) services. We are also working with DHCS on the coming changes to align with MH in that we will be able to do field-based services and offer SUD assessments. In addition, Mobile Crisis Services continues to serve SUD client population to ensure they get services timely both crisis and non-crisis under the CARES/CCMU grant. Lastly, I continue to work with my partners to co-locate SUD (and MH) staff to their departments to ensure timely access to services (i.e., CalWORKs MAP, Justice Center, CAPMC, MRM, Jail, Sheriff, etc.).
- C. Mobile Crisis, Non-Crisis Services
 - a. As of 6/17/24, the C.A.R.E.S. (Crisis, Assessment, Response, Evaluation, Services) Team under the CCMU (Crisis Care Mobile Unit under CalAIM), continue to provide excellent and timely services county wide.
 - b. The team continues to have multiple requests from Oakhurst Region.
 - c. We are planning to decentralize CARES staff to the Oakhurst and Chowchilla regions, as indicated in our CCMU Plan for quicker response to the community.
- D. HEDIS Measures for MH and SUD
 - a. See attached measures for MH and SUD per DHCS.
 - b. These measures will be incorporated in our EHR to ensure we can collect this data for required DHCS reports.
 - c. The Data Sub-Committee of BHAB will focus on these data elements



- VI. Change in BHS Access Number Summer 2024
 - A. BHS is in the process of getting new phones and new phone numbers.
 - B. Our Centralized Access & Crisis Number will change to: (559) 395-0451.
 - C. Information is being posted in our website and all our forms, flyers, etc.

 - B. June 19, 2024 is Juneteenth. A day of celebration of freedom among our African American Population in Madera County. Events taking place today. One took place at 10:00am at Madera Courthouse Museum Park and Board of Supervisors (BOS) prepared a Proclamation, which Supervisor Leticia Gonzalez was scheduled to present today.

VIII. Announcements

- A. MCH provided a copy of Press Release indicating that they got the Distressed Hospital Loan by the State which will help them prepare for a reopening later this year. See attached copy of Press Release.
- B. HOPE Center
 - BHS is partnering with Public Health to be in a joint Administrative Building, which will allow BHS to move its administrative divisions and Outreach and Engagement Teams to Road 28 in proximity to PH and DSS campus. Meetings just started so a more complete update will be shared later this year. Moving to this new building will allow for program expansion as planned with CalAIM, Proposition 1, OSF Plan, SB43 LPS Reform, CARE Court and other growth planned and to save on leasing other facilities.

DISCUSSION / FISCAL IMPACT / STRATEGIC FOCUS:

DISCUSSION:

WestCare California, Inc. provides mobile crisis response mental health services for all ages in conjunction with the Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS), Madera Police Department (MPD), Madera County Sheriff's Department (MCSO), and other county and community partners. This program provides mobile emergency response services, mental health services, crisis intervention, wellness planning, warm hand-offs, linkage and referral. These collaborative crisis intervention services are provided in the field and in the office. Crisis Workers provide referrals and services in the community to de-escalate crisis situations. These intervention services should reduce the number of acute psychiatric crises (written 5150's) referred to the



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nearby emergency departments and Valley Children's Hospital Emergency Department by the MPD or MCSO.

The requested amendment is to include Paragraph 7 "Use of County Facility" and Paragraph 8 "Access to Electronic Health Record" to address WestCare staff occupying office space at MCSO to provide Crisis Care Mobile Unit (CCMU) services to the community of Madera County.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There will be no impact to the County's General Fund.

CONNECTION TO THE COUNTY OF MADERA STRATEGIC PLAN - MISSION 2023:

This contract meets the goal of the Strategic Focus Area of Health by providing mobile crisis response mental health services to Madera County residents.

DISCUSSION / FISCAL IMPACT / STRATEGIC FOCUS:

DISCUSSION:

River Vista Behavioral Health (River Vista) is owned and operated by Universal Health Services, Inc. (UHS). UHS operates 26 acute care hospitals, 335 behavioral health facilities, 39 outpatient facilities and ambulatory care access points, and various related services located in 30 U.S. states, Washington D.C., Puerto Rico and the United Kingdom.

River Vista will provide a full continuum of inpatient services to children, adolescent, and adults and offer a robust outpatient program to address the most prevalent behavioral health concerns. One 24-bed unit will be dedicated specifically to pediatric psychiatric care, treatment, services and educational needs, assisting Valley Children's in

addressing the needs of patients presenting to the Emergency Department.

Madera County contracts with several psychiatric hospitals for inpatient services. Hospitalization is of an urgent nature and River Vista is the only psychiatric hospital in Madera County. It is important Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS) has options available to ensure appropriate placement for residents of Madera County.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The costs associated with this agreement will be funded by Mental Health Realignment funds and Medi-Cal reimbursement; therefore, there will be no impact to the County's General Fund.

CONNECTION TO THE COUNTY OF MADERA STRATEGIC PLAN - MISSION 2023:

This contract meets the goal of the Strategic Focus Area of Health by providing mental health services to MCDBHS clients.

Aside from hospitalization and State Hospital placement, an IMD provides the highest level of care (in a secured facility) available for mental health clients. On March 1, 2011 your Board approved the consolidation of the Madera County Mental Health and Alcohol Advisory Boards into a single Behavioral Health Board that convened on July 1, 2011. The authority for the Mental Health Board is provided by the State of California pursuant to Section 5604 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, so in combining the Boards we were mandated to continue to maintain a Board with a minimum of ten members citing mental health concerns as their primary reason for serving on the Board.

Legislation requires that Board members shall have a professional interest in or a personal commitment to mental health issues and/or alleviating problems related to alcohol/drug abuse in the community. Each of the recommended appointments is in

accordance with this criteria.

The goal is to have equal representation from each district as stipulated within Article V our Bylaws which states in part:

There shall be an equal number of appointees by each member of the Board of Supervisors. Each Supervisor shall appoint two members that cite mental health issues as their primary reason for serving on the Behavioral Health Board, and one member that cites AOD issues as their primary concern. The Board may recommend appointees to the Board of Supervisors.

Ms. Norris and Ms. Diaz reside in and would both represent District 2. Ms. Norris and Ms. Diaz have a professional interest in or a personal commitment to mental heath issues. The Behavioral Health Board unanimously approved the recommendation of Mary Norris and Sharon Diaz at their May 15, 2024 meeting.

There are four (4) vacancies that remain to be filled for the districts listed below. Three representatives needed for Mental Health issues on behalf of Districts No. 1 and No. 2 and one representative needed for AUD/SUD on behalf of District No. 1.

Vista Pacifica Center operates a State-licensed Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) and Institute for the Mentally Disordered (IMD). These facilities provide varying degrees of residential care services for adults with severe and persistent mental illness. Aside from hospitalization and State Hospital placement, an IMD provides the highest level of care, in a secured facility, available for mental health clients. Clients may be placed in such a facility following hospitalization for transitional or long-term residential care.

It is often difficult to find appropriate residential placement for mentally ill residents of Madera County. Placement in mental health facilities is usually of an urgent nature, and it is important that Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS) has options available to ensure appropriate placement for seriously mentally

The State of California through the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is administering the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing Program (BHBH Program), including noncompetitive predetermined maximum funding to be awarded to county behavioral health agencies to operate bridge housing settings to address the immediate and sustainable housing needs of people experiencing homelessness who have serious behavioral health conditions, including serious mental illness (SMI) and/or substance use disorder (SUD).

The Madera County Department of Behavioral Health Services (MCDBHS) will utilize the funds to lease up to 37 housing units at Casa Grande Motel. The housing units will be leased to meet the needs of BHBH Program participants who face housing instability



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and homelessness among people with severe behavioral health conditions. Depending on their individual care plan under the MCDBHS treatment program, participants can remain in these housing units for an initial 6 months and after further evaluation, extend up to 12 months total. The goal is to provide a stable temporary housing situation with supportive wraparound services while an individual is locating, applying for, and/or obtaining permanent housing.

MCDBHS intends to contract with a partner to provide mental health, substance abuse, and/or co-occurring disorder services on-site 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year, along with other BHBH Program services such as rental assistance, utility assistance, housing navigation, transportation, etc.

The costs associated with this lease agreement will be funded by BHBH funds distributed by the DHCS; therefore, there will be no impact to the County's General Fund.






