## **COMMENTS**

The Madera County Public Works Department uses Road Funds to typically maintain, repair, and reconstruct roads, bridges, and traffic control devices on the County's maintained mileage system, in Maintenance Districts, and in County Service Areas within the unincorporated area except for State Highways. The Department maintains about 1,529 miles of roads and 170 bridges. This budget is primarily financed by State Fuel Taxes, Federal-State Allocations, Forest Reserve Funds, Special District Service Charges, State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ), Transportation Enhancement Activities (TEA), Proposition 1B, Public Transportation Modernization Improvement and Service Enhancement Account (PTMISEA), American Reinvestment Recovery Act (ARRA), and Traffic Mitigation Fees. The Department receives a five-cent property tax from District No. 5. The revenues from Measures "A" and "T" sales tax funds augment Departmental efforts but are not reflected in this budget. The revenue from Measure "T" provides additional funding, some of which can be used on maintenance activities and significantly improves the Department's preventive maintenance program. In addition, the Measure also addresses congestion issues on a regional basis.

No portion of this budget is financed by local property taxes, except for District No. 5 in the northeastern portion of the County, which had levied a property tax prior to Proposition 13; and this activity is <u>not</u> part of the General Fund Budget.

Note: The Transit Budget was established and not included in the Road Fund Budget in order to simplify the accounts of Transit funds, projects, and issues. Refer to Road Transit Budget (Org 63860) for specific details.

#### Note:

- (1) The vacant Assistant Engineer position is utilized primarily for field work/inspection and we are in need of an office Engineer position (Engineer I/II/III) to perform project design/management. We are currently underfilling a Sr. Civil position with an Engineer I/II/III staff person, so converting the Assistant Engineer position to an Engineer I/II/III will allow this staff person to work in the position consistent with their classification and re-open the Sr. Civil Engineer position for advancement opportunity for staff.
- (2) The addition of two (2) Engineering Technicians will allow the department to hire permanent staff as opposed to continuing to utilize Extra Help staff on an ongoing basis. These positions will provide the much needed support for project delivery and for assisting with processing the quickly increasing development projects in the County.

#### **RECAP OF MAJOR EXPENDITURE ACCOUNTS:**

- **Communications** (\$25,000) is recommended reduced \$12,849 for the Department's estimated communications costs. Charges for the Department's pro-rated share of the Wide Area Network Communication expense; as estimated by the Information Technology Department, are now accounted for under 731400 Interfund Expense.
- **Microwave Radio Services** (\$111,479) is recommended increased \$7,421 based on current year costs of the Department's contribution to the Internal Service Fund for 2016-17 which is based on the number of radios in this Department utilizing the County's Microwave Radio Network.
- **720601** <u>Insurance Other</u> (\$11,733) is recommended unchanged based on current year costs for Property and Pollution Insurance.
- **Maintenance Equipment** (\$700,000) is recommended unchanged based on current year and projected expenditures for all equipment repairs, parts, fuels, tires, and overhauls. This account also provides funds for maintenance of office equipment, mobile radios, and other types of maintenance and repair, as well as the Wide Area Network Maintenance cost.
- **Professional & Specialized Services** (\$4,179,532) is recommended reduced \$2,254,800 for the proposed capital improvement projects as outlined in the Department's Capital Improvement Program. Costs for Information Technology services, Human Resources, General Services and the 311/Customer Service Center are now accounted for under 731400 Interfund Expense.

### **RECAP OF MAJOR EXPENDITURE ACCOUNTS**: (continued)

- **Rents & Leases Equipment** (\$270,000) is recommended reduced \$25,000 based on projected expenditures to rent/lease equipment when County-owned equipment breaks down, or when it is more economical to rent equipment than to purchase equipment. This account also funds the rental of mowing equipment used for special grants in use this fiscal year.
- **Special Departmental Expense** (\$2,413,033) is recommended reduced \$1,386,845 based on projected expenditures for the purchase of all road construction materials, asphalt, concrete, various road oils, rock, sand, and dirt. This account also funds preliminary engineering and construction engineering costs associated with the Department's Capital Improvement Program. This account will be adjusted at Final Budget based on the ending cash balance.
- 731400 Interfund Expenses (\$514,721) is recommended based on current year costs of the Department's reimbursement of expenses for Public Works staff time spent on Road Fund tasks (\$149,292), Information Technology services (\$136,629), Human Resources services (\$25,000), 311 services (\$2,000), Building and Grounds Maintenance (\$1,800), and Employer Share of Retiree Health Insurance (\$200,000).
- 731401 <u>Interfund Expense Cost Plan (A-87)</u> (\$362,012) is recommended reduced \$549,384 based on the prior year's Cost Allocation Plan. This report is in the process of being prepared by an outside consulting firm that allocates the County's prorata share of indirect expenses to this budget.

## **FIXED ASSETS**

**740300** Equipment (\$853,000) is recommended reduced \$335,500 to purchase the following equipment:

- Regular Cab Service Truck with Utility Service Body and Crane (\$100,000) This truck would be a support vehicle for the construction crew. It would be equipped with the needed tools to complete the different road construction, bridge and guardrail projects throughout the county. It would replace a 1994 GMC service truck that is 21 years old with over 225,000 miles on it. This truck would be assigned to Dist #6. (11803)
- Mechanical Broom Sweeper (\$300,000) This power sweeper would be a support vehicle for road construction and chip seal projects. It would also be utilized in subdivisions for gutter and road cleanup. It would replace a 2002 Elgin Crosswind sweeper that was burned beyond repair. This power sweeper would be assigned county wide. (11803)

# **FIXED ASSETS (continued)**

- 1 Tandem Axle Dump Trailer (\$12,000) This trailer could be utilized county wide and would be used to assist with road construction, bridge, guardrail and county cleanup projects. This trailer would be assigned to Dist #6. (11803)
- 1 10-yard Diesel Dump Truck (\$150,000) This truck would replace 1992 Ford Dump Truck that does not meet Calif. Air Resources Board On-Road Heavy-Duty Diesel-Fueled Public and Utility Fleets program regulations. This vehicle would be assigned to Dist #3. (11813)
- 1 **Utility Truck (\$125,000)** This truck would be used county wide to haul paint and materials to different road construction projects. It would replace a 34 year old, 1981 Ford F700 flatbed truck that is worn out. This vehicle would be assigned county wide. (11803)
- 1 Caterpillar CW14 Nine Wheel Pneumatic Roller (\$145,000) This unit would be used to assist paving operations and would replace a 1993 Rosco pneumatic roller loader that does not meet California Air Resources Board In-Use Off-Road Diesel Vehicle Regulation. This roller would be assigned county wide. (11803)
- Portable Changeable Message Board (\$21,000) These message boards would be used for traffic control, safety and emergency communications throughout the County. These would be assigned to the Traffic Crew, Dist #10. (11805)
