COMMENTS

Existing law requires Cal Works program recipients under 19 years of age and who are pregnant or custodial parents to participate in certain educational programs, which are referred to as the Cal-Learn Program. A Cal-Learn Program participant is entitled to monetary supplements or bonuses, as specified, for maintaining satisfactory educational progress, and successfully completing high school or a California High School Equivalency Examination.

The Cal-Learn program was transferred to the County Public Health Department on May 18, 2004, through an agreement with Department of Social Services. The priorities of this program are case management services to Cal-Learn clients. Program services are provided in Madera, Eastern Madera County, and Chowchilla. This Program is administered by the Madera County Public Health Department, and follows Adolescent Family Life Program (AFLP) standards of care.

On March 24, 2011, Governor Brown signed SB 72, which addresses reductions to Cal Works, including Cal Learn. This bill makes all provisions of the Cal-Learn Program inoperative from July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, with the exception of the payment of supplements and bonuses to eligible participants (payments are from the Department of Social Services, and not out this budget). These provisions making the Cal-Learn Program inoperative would be repealed on July 1, 2012, as specified. The bill repeals related inoperative provisions and authorizes implementation of the Cal-Learn provisions by all-county letters or similar instructions from the department, pending the adoption of emergency regulations by July 1, 2012.

Rather than dismantling the Cal-Learn program for one year, the Public Health Department is requesting continuance of the program for FY 2011-12 using Health Realignment Trust Fund.
