Modern public health became an essential governmental function with specialized public health agencies.

Infectious Disease

Public Health 2.0 (1970's - early 2000's)


- Public health agencies became professionalized and standardized.
 - ✓ Goals and core functions.
 - ✓ Capacities and performance standards.
- Health education expanded to include chronic disease prevention

Public Health 3.0 (current)

- Improve social determinants of health
- Chief Health Strategist: Engage multiple sectors & community partners to generate collective impact.

Public health aims to prevent disease, promote health, and prolong life among the population as a whole by providing conditions in which people can be healthy.


